A Walk Thru the Bible: The Davidic Covenant

II Samuel 7:8 To my servant David, thus says the Lord...16 ...your throne shall be established forever.

Psalm 89:3 "I have made a covenant with...My servant David. 29 His seed I will make to endure forever, and his throne... 30 "If his sons forsake My law... 32 then I will punish their transgression... 33 Nevertheless... 34 My covenant I will not break, 36 His seed shall endure forever, and his throne..."

Matthew 1:1 The book of the genealogy of Jesus Christ, the Son of David, the Son of Abraham:

Luke 1:30 The angel said to...Mary...31 Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bring forth a Son, and shall call His name JESUS. 32 "The Lord God will give Him the throne of His father David; 33 and He will reign over the house of Jacob forever; and His kingdom will have no end."

Matthew 21:5 "' Behold, your King is coming to you, lowly, and sitting on a donkey.'" 9 " Hosanna to the Son of David! "

Matthew 27:11 The governor questioned Him..., "Are You the King of the Jews?" And Jesus said to him, "It is as you say."

John 19:14 And he said to the Jews, "Behold, your King!" 15 They therefore cried out, "Away with Him, away with Him, crucify Him!"

Matthew 27:37 They put up above His head the charge against Him which read "This is Jesus the King of the Jews."

Zechariah 14:2 I will gather all the nations to battle against Jerusalem... 3 Then the LORD will go forth and fight against those nations... 4 And in that day His feet will stand on the Mount of Olives. 9 And the LORD shall be King over all the earth. 17...come up to Jerusalem to worship the King.

Isaiah 2:3 ...Out of Zion shall go forth the law, and the word of the LORD from Jerusalem. 4 He shall judge between the nations... nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war anymore.

Isaiah 11:9 ...The earth shall be full of the knowledge of the LORD...

John 3:3 Jesus...said to him, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God." 16 For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life.

II Timothy 2:12 If we endure, we shall also reign with Him.

Matthew 6:10 Thy Kingdom come. Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

5. Can you tell what difference it makes (or should make) in your life to pray as Jesus taught us to pray in Matthew 6:10?

7. If the truth of II Timothy 2:12 has made a difference in your life, can you tell about it?
